Changes to No Boycott Requirements

Pursuant to Texas Government Code

§ 2274.002, effective September 01, 2021, two new no boycott requirements are enacted into law for procurements \$100,000 and greater, and that are paid in whole or in part with state funds.

Changes to No Boycott Requirements

- Senate Bill 13 prohibits contracting with companies that boycott energy companies.
- Senate Bill 19 prohibits contracting with companies that boycott firearms and ammunition companies.
- The no boycott of Israel requirement is still in effect.

Procedures and Form

- UHS Purchasing Guidelines, Section, 7.5 Purchases \$100k and greater was revised.
- No Boycott Business Process Decision Tree
- Certifications of No Boycott Form
 - Replaces the No Boycott of Israel Form
- Attestation Form

The Certification of No Boycott Form

- This Form consolidates No Boycott of Israel, Energy, Firearms, and Ammunition companies into a single, three-page document.
- This Form is required for all purchases \$100k and greater (Contract or Purchase Order) that is paid in whole or in part with state money.

Business Process

- The requesting department is responsible for obtaining the completed certification form from the vendor.
- The requesting department will sign a certificate of attestation for requirements \$100,000 and greater, when the Certification of No Boycott is not completed that no state funds will be used on the Purchase Order or for the entire term of the contract.
