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UH Transfer Rules

- Courses taken at HCC must be completed with a C- or better.
- A maximum of 66 lower-level transfer credits can be used towards a UH bachelor's degree.
- A maximum of 2 credit hours in physical activity courses can transfer.

Major Requirements

- **B.S. Math & Science:** complete 18 hours of core Mathematics; core Life & Physical Science courses; or approved non-core courses. ECON 3320 and ECON 3370 can fulfill this requirement.
- **CLASS Block:** complete 6 hours of CLASS coursework in two different fields outside of the major that does not overlap with core, B.S., or major requirements. Approved subjects include ANTH, COMM (or SPCH), ENGL (excluding 2311), FREN, GOVT, HIST, PHIL, PSYC (excluding 2314), SGNL, SOCI, or SPAN.
- **CLASS Peoples & Societies:** complete an approved course (see UH catalog).
- **Minor:** complete a minor or approved substitute. No more than 6 hours of major coursework can be used towards the minor.
