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UH Transfer Rules

- Courses taken at LC must be completed with a C- or better.
- A maximum of 66 lower-level transfer credits can be used towards a UH bachelor's degree.
- A maximum of 2 credit hours in physical activity courses can transfer.

Major Requirements

- **B.S. Math & Science:** complete 18 hours of core Mathematics; core Life & Physical Science courses; or non-core BCHS, BIOL, CHEM, COSC, GEOL, MATH, and PHYS courses. Select CLASS courses can be used towards this requirement (see UH advisor for full list).
- Two of the three minors must be CLASS minors. One minor can be selected from all eligible programs of UH colleges, including those that are outside of CLASS.
- Courses taken for one minor cannot be used to satisfy requirements in either of the other two minors.
- The CLASS Block and CLASS Peoples & Societies requirements are not required for the Liberal Studies major.
