- **Location:**
 - Situated within the University of Houston campus.
 - Convenient access to the university's facilities and amenities, while being close to downtown, the Medical Center, and Hobby Airport.
- **Accommodations:**
 - Features 150 rooms that provide comfortable and modern lodging options for guests.
 - Rooms are designed to cater to the needs of both business and leisure travelers.
- **Event and meeting space:**
 - Offers 25,000 square feet of meeting and event space, ideal for conferences, weddings, and other events.
 - Equipped with state-of-the-art facilities to ensure successful events.
- **Dining:**
 - Home to Eric's Restaurant, which offers a variety of dining options featuring American and international cuisine.
 - The new Cougar Grounds coffee shop provides a casual spot for guests and students to enjoy specialty coffee and light snacks.

History of the Hilton Hotel & College

1969

- Hilton College was founded in 1969 by Conrad N. Hilton, the founder of Hilton Hotels, with the vision to create a premier institution for hospitality education.

1975

- Hilton College was built, including the hotel and conference center.
- 80 rooms and 24,000 square feet of meeting space.

1983

- South wing developed.
- Expanded to 94,000 square feet of education and meeting space.

2010


- A \$12.5-million renovation aimed at upgrading the hotel's facilities.
- Created an enhanced experimental learning environment for students.
- Marked the first significant renovation since the hotel's opening in 1975.

2022

- A \$30.4 million expansion and renovation to build a 70-room tower, expanding accommodation capacity.
- Added a new location for the Cougar Grounds coffee shop.
- Established the Center for Student Success to support the educational needs of hospitality students.




Sysco Student Kitchen

The 1,920-square-foot Sysco Student Kitchen made its official debut during a special ribbon-cutting and donor recognition open house held on March 19, 2019. This was the first major renovation to our instructional kitchen lab since it opened its doors in 1989. The “extreme makeover” began late in 2018. The entire space was completely gutted and rebuilt from the ground up.




Cougar Grounds Coffee Shop




Eric's Club Center for Student Success




