Assist in the implementation of Pre/Post testing for EMPOWER and Mental Health Coach trainings. Track and organize key performance indicators (KPIs), including awareness metrics, training completions, and referrals made. Community Sampling & Fieldwork Support in recruitment efforts for diverse focus groups and key informant interviews.
Help implement a sector-specific sampling strategy, including participant outreach in churches and schools. Support logistics and note-taking during focus group sessions. Research & Evaluation Assist in reviewing data using structured coding and mixed-method integration approaches. Collaborate with senior researchers on synthesizing findings across sectors. Maintain accurate documentation for IRB, compliance, informed consent, and confidentiality standards. Project Support Attend weekly team meetings and quarterly advisory committee sessions.
Contribute to the ongoing needs of the project related to data collection and organization, sampling, analysis and reporting. Support preparation of reports, presentations, and potential academic publications
