The Bereavement Coordinator will work collaboratively with members of the palliative care interdisciplinary team and other healthcare providers to ensure the delivery of compassionate, dignified, and exceptional patient care that encompasses the full spectrum of bereavement needs of patients and families faced with potentially life threatening or life altering illnesses.</p> <p>Responsibilities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develops and provides ongoing educational opportunities for staff and palliative care trainees to guide their preparation to care for dying patients and their families (i.e. bereavement/death issues) • Coordinates grief support services for patients/families across the care continuum, in accordance with their plans of care, while conducting assessments and responding accordingly with any changes in plan. • Ability to demonstrate initiative, good judgment and problem-solving skills, leadership ability and a professional demeanor. • Ability to demonstrate excellent professional listening and communication skills, time and resource management skills, excellent facilitation and coordination skills. • Capable of relating to diverse developmental, religious, cultural and demographic backgrounds. • Support our outpatient families from a psychosocial perspective. • Provide interdisciplinary care along with our outpatient providers.
